Be genuine in your praise (really mean what you say)

Be specific (praise specific actions)

Share your child's accomplishments (tell others what your child has done!)



Encourage your student to recognize their strengths this month. Once we come to a place where we know who we are in Christ, and what strengths we carry, then we can celebrate the strengths and gifts of others. This is how we can live out the Catchphrase: I Get to Be Me, You Get to Be You! Here are some ways you can **Continue the Conversation** at home this month:

- 1. I have unique qualities that God created.
- 2. God created others with different qualities.
- 3. I can appreciate what makes my friends and I special.
- 4. I can use my words and actions to celebrate others.

BE INTENTIONAL Review the Strengths Finder chart (see below). You can use this to have intentional conversations with your student(s) about the strengths you see in them. Also, take time to model recognizing your own strengths. What strengths do they possess? How are those different or the same as yours? Consider how the people you know are different from each other and from you! Discuss how individual differences are actually a strength. Have fun building your students up and create meaningful points of connection! Your students are learning relationship skills that will benefit them for a lifetime!

K-8 Tuition Assistance

Step 1: Complete application online through FACTS

Step 2: Submit payment for application (\$40)

Step 3: Submit ALL 2024 tax documents by April 10

- Applicant & co-applicant must submit tax docs
- Taxes do not have to be filed, but must be prepared and uploaded to application

Step 4: CHECK EMAIL

- FACTS representatives will email if documentation is missing. Please respond as soon as possible and check your junk folder for FACTS emails.

Required Documentation

- 2024—1040 Tax Form (page 1 & 2)
- 2024 W2
- Business Income docs
 - \Rightarrow Schedule 1—5, C, E, K, etc.
- Non-taxable docs
 - ⇒ Child support, SNAP, TANF, Social Security

Do You Qualify?

- If at least 10% of income from 2024 is used to cover the cost of a child/ children's Lutheran K-8 net tuition
- 2. Child/children must be enrolled at the school by April 30 to be eligible for a scholarship during the May awards
